



A look at the 1st OAAOM Biennium Budget (2009-2010)

The estimated budget and costs for managing tasks and responsibilities to Oregon L. Ac.'s is given for a 2 year period. A 2-year budget cycle is being used for this new organization, during the first five years of its life, to plan ahead and to ensure stability as new Board members will be elected every year, starting 2009.

Tentative 2009-2010 Budget: How we plan to our use funds for the benefit of our profession in the next two years-

2009-2010 Biennium Lobbying efforts :	\$50,000
Annual Conference:	\$18,000
Website updates and maintenance:	\$2,500
Legal & Professional Services	\$4,000
Administrative (Bookkeeper, etc.)	\$2,500
National Organization Membership	\$2,000
Mailings by US Postal Service (2 per year):	\$2,500
e-Newsletter editor (12 issues per year):	\$2,400
e-Newsletter (iContact):	\$250
Stationery, Office Supplies:	\$250
Total:	\$84,400

Special Note

We believe that hiring an Executive Director or a Senior Office Manager, to manage Administrative tasks for the OAAOM, will help us to be more effective in promoting our medicine across the state in the long-term.

Half time funding for an E.D. or senior Office Manager will cost an additional \$25-30 K per year. This cost has not been included in the budget.
